# **Summer Reading Supports Literacy**

Parents with children in public and private schools alike have spent the past two years worried about the same thing: What is COVID, and all its restrictions, doing to my child's education?

Despite heroic efforts by parents, teachers, and schools, the isolation and chaos of COVID took a toll. According to a study by the Brookings Institution published in March ("The pandemic has had devastating impacts on learning. What will it take to help students catch up?"), reading test scores for children in grades 3 - 8 dropped significantly between fall 2019, before the pandemic, and fall 2021, one year into the pandemic. Additionally, reading test score gaps between low- and high-poverty

elementary schools widened during the pandemic.

While public libraries aren't schools, we take our mission to support and encourage literacy very seriously, and this year's summer reading theme reflects that focus, with an emphasis on learning and growth, both intellectually and in the garden. Preschoolers through grade 5 will be "Growing to New Heights," and teens will be encouraged to "Grow Your Own Way." In addition to reading, programs throughout the summer will focus on hands-on learning activities and topics such as environmentally friendly crafts, gardening, and even bugs and worms.

Kids can win other fun prizes, but our book prizes are a crucial part of our program. Having books in the home sends a strong message that reading is an integral, life-long skill that plays a part in every aspect of our lives, including giving us joy.
