
- Survey went live on Monday, July 8, at 10 a.m. Closed Monday, July 29 (due to staff illness Survey Monkey links were open until Tuesday July 30, 8 a.m.).
- Shared by eBlast, website link (home page), public computers in buildings, social media, and displays in Library buildings with paper copies. Also shared by tenants and the City of CH
- As of 10 a.m. Tuesday, July 30, 1,474 people responded, minus 213 ineligible (non-residents), for a total of 1,258.
- Focus of the survey was on Library's role as owner, financial viability of the building, and possible future uses, which is why we limited it to residents/tax payers.

CPC directed their supporters to fill out the survey in specific ways, which can be seen at times in the use of identical wording, etc. We believe this interfered with the intent of the survey, which was to ask the larger tax-paying community about how they want the library to spend their tax dollars, and also ascertain current awareness of Library spending on big projects. This turned the survey into a partial referendum on whether the tenants are doing good work. We have never disputed this, but it has no bearing on the Library's finances or other resources.

























Q10 Do you think Heights Libraries should pay for capital expenses for the Coventry PEACE Building by any of the following? Choose one.
